Week 1 was: A New Identity

Written by who? Author: Thats right Paul, an Apostle of Jesus Christ by the will of God

Written to who?, Audience: that's right the **Saints, faithful in Christ Jesus**, **In Christ Jesus, In Him, In the Beloved:** this is a key, a really significant phrase. It appears about 10x in the first 13 verses. It appears about 130x in this epistle or letter to the church.

It is a letter that is written to those who are IN CHRIST, those whose faith is in the Lord Jesus from an Apostle of Jesus Christ!

- 1. What was the intension behind the drawing called the DUCK RABBIT ILLUSION in the Pastor's message?
- 2. Which animal did you see first?
- 3. Were you a little surprised that the other people saw a different animal?
- 4. Give other examples of how two people can see the same thing and come to a different conclusion. Example: a car wreck
- 4. What is the longest sentence in the bible?
- 5. How many greek words does it contain?

- 6. What are two of the most controversial words in the longest sentence in the bible?
- 7. What makes these words so contested among Christians?
- 8. Who does Paul praise first in this passage?
- 9. What two things can we join Paul in praising God for?
- 10. What makes Paul's praise so unusual and untimely?
- 11. Who are the two who's mentioned in verse 4?
- 12. Discuss who you believe God to be and who you understand us to be, as referred to in this passage?
- 13. When was God's choice of us made?
- 14. Discuss why this a problem in many Christian conversations?
- 15. What two things did God choose for us to be according to verse 4?
- 16. Why did God chose us and how does that link to the word predestination in this passage as spelled out in verse 5?
- 17. Discuss how God's choice, God's predestination and God's adoption compliment each other regarding us, the faithful in Christ Jesus?

- 18. What is the component of adoption that we have not experienced yet?
- 19. What topics or thoughts about today's message make you think differently about salvation?
- 20. what topics for thoughts about today's message leave you a bit confused or concerned?
